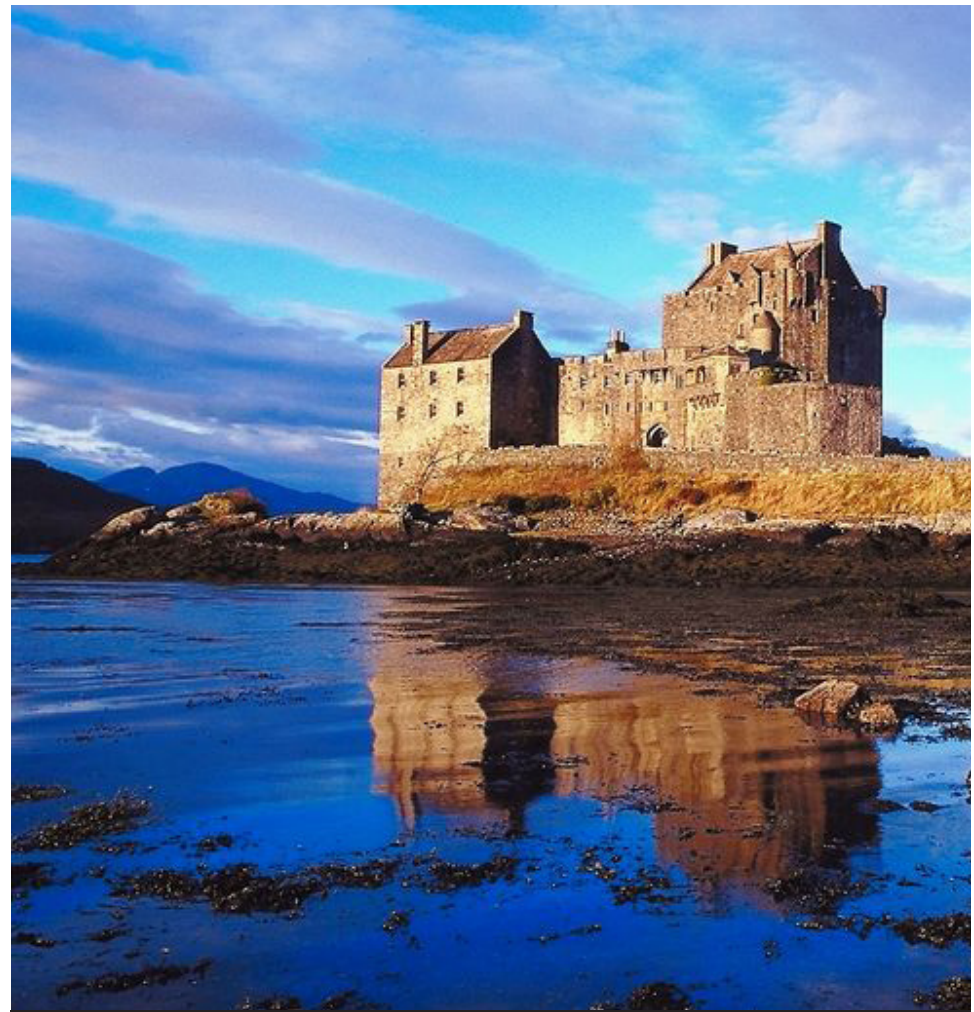

Summer Study in England and Scotland

June 24 – July 9, 2008

Spend eleven days in London and three in Edinburgh studying history, theatre and philosophy. Students will visit famous sites like Westminster Abbey, tour historic houses and castles like the Palace of Holyroodhouse in Edinburgh, see great works of art in the British Museum and the National Gallery, and experience live theatre in the famous West End and in a reconstruction of Shakespeare's Globe. Students will have the opportunity to take any number of the three courses offered. There will be required course meetings during the two weeks prior to departure and work due upon return. The courses offered are as follows:

HIS 211 History of England

This course surveys the history of the British Isles from pre-Celtic times to the present.

SPD 232 Theatre History II

This course analyzes and studies theatre history to include architecture, performers and performance, playwrights, stage, production methods and audience from the Elizabethan era through modern drama.

PHI 200 The History of Western Philosophy

This course offers a brief historical survey of major philosophers from the pre-Socratics to the present.
