NOTES:

- Students are strongly encouraged to complete their SDV, ENG, and MTH requirements first.
- Students must consult with an advisor since math requirements of different majors vary by program and transfer institution.
- It is recommended that the history requirement include American History and History of Western Civilizations or History of World Civilizations. Students should consult prospective four-year institutions.
- Students must demonstrate competency in a foreign language through the 202 level by completing appropriate courses and/or examinations. Placement in foreign language is by SAT II Subject Test score or departmental recommendation. Students who are not required to take introductory-level courses should substitute other approved electives. See Note 8.
- The laboratory science requirement can be satisfied by the following courses: BIO 101, BIO 102, BIO 110, BIO 120, CHM 101, CHM 102, CHM 111, CHM 112, ENV 121, ENV 122, GOL 105, NAS 125, PHY 101, PHY 102, PHY 150, PHY 201, PHY 202, PHY 241, and PHY 242. Two different science disciplines are recommended and even required at some transfer institutions.
- ECO 120 may be used as a standard course option for some colleges and universities. Please consult with your transfer institution.
- The literature elective requirement can be satisfied by any 200-level English literature course, exclusive of composition and creative writing courses.
- Some senior institutions require a philosophy or religion course, a second math course, a public speaking course, or a computer literacy course. Students planning to transfer to Virginia Commonwealth University may need to take ENG 210. Students should review the requirements for a history or social studies major at their prospective four-year institution.
