**NOTES AND ADDITIONAL CURRICULUM OPTIONS:**

1. Students applying for the JTCC Nursing Program may elect to take MTH 155 Statistical Reasoning as the math required for admission to the JTCC Nursing Program (starting Spring 2019).
2. Students are eligible to apply to the nursing program while enrolled in or after completion of the first semester prerequisites courses.
3. Students are reminded to consult with their transfer institution and faculty advisors about the varying science requirements of BSN and health science programs.
4. Students should consult with their transfer institutions on this requirement. Some institutions may require a HIS elective. Students can choose CST 100 or from one of the following HIS electives: HIS 101 History of Western Civ I, HIS 102 History of Western Civ II, HIS 111 History of World Civ I, HIS 112 History of World Civ II, HIS 121 United States History I, or HIS 122 United States History II.
5. Students should regularly meet with their faculty advisor and check their advisement report in MyTyler – SIS.
